ATTENDANCE/ PUNCTUALITY

The Local Offer is an online resource that details information about the support, services and guidance available in Blackburn with Darwen for children and young people from birth to 25 years who have SEND (special educational needs and disabilities) and their families.

The directory has information about education, employment, health and care services, leisure and support groups all in one place.

It has links to information inside and outside of Blackburn with Darwen. For example this could be information on a neighbouring local college and national societies that you may wish to use. This is known as the 'Local Offer'

The NEW design has been co-produced with local children, young people, parent / carers, Parents in Partnership (PIP) Parent/ Carer Forum and 'Friends of the Local Offer Group'.

There is also a new children and young people's zone 'SEND STATION' a dedicated area designed by children and young people for children and young people which will continue to grow and be developed with them, for them. They will then start to write a diary entry accounting from a warriors point of view, based on the events from the book. In Maths, Year 5 have established a further understanding of fractions and how to multiply a fraction from an amount. This learning is built upon in the next steps of their learning, when they multiply non-unit fractions and mixed numbers."

"Please continue reading with your child and ask relevant questions to help them improve their vocabulary and their comprehension skills. Also, please could you support your child to complete their assignments on Century Tech."

Year 6 have been working amazingly hard this week. We have started looking at a new book called Tom's Midnight Garden in English and we are still working on Fractions, decimals and percentages in Maths.
